When you're watching a team in the playoffs, and they lose, there's this moment when you can't believe it's over. An entire season, with all of its promises, all of its great moments, ends. Actually, this isn't even about whether they win or lose. The only time I've seen a season end with my team on top, the 2001 Arizona Diamondbacks, while I was excited, there was a bit of emptiness at the thought that the season was over. It'd never happen again.

Life is like this. There are seasons. Some of them are great, and some of them are meh. But they all play out and wrap up eventually, and we're asked to let go of what has been, and move into the unfamiliar future. There can be a sense of emptiness as we look back on what has been, and forward to what is not yet. You can try as hard as you can to cling to the past, but it'll always be behind you.

The author of Ecclesiastes wrote about these seasons like this:

"For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born and a time to die; a time to plant and a time to pluck up what is planted;

a time to kill and a time to heal; a time to break down and a time to build up;

a time to weep and a time to laugh; a time to mourn and a time to dance; a time to throw away stones and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace and a time to refrain from embracing;

a time to seek and a time to lose; a time to keep and a time to throw away;

a time to tear and a time to sew; a time to keep silent and a time to speak;

a time to love and a time to hate; a time for war and a time for peace."

Seasons change. All we can do is enjoy them while they last, and move on to the next one when it comes. As the author continues:

"What gain have the workers from their toil? I have seen the business that God has given to everyone to be busy with. He has made everything suitable for its time; moreover, he has put a sense of past and future into their minds, yet they cannot find out what God has done from the beginning to the end. I know that there is nothing better for them than to be happy and enjoy themselves as long as they live; moreover, it is God's gift that all should eat and drink and take pleasure in all their toil.

Fall is rolling in. The season of summer, with its memories and activities, is over. There may be other seasons in your life that are winding down, while others may be beginning. The same is true of the church: seasons come and seasons go. I hope that in all things, we'll heed the words of Ecclesiastes, and find joy in all of our toil.
